Parent's Right to Know:

- Students are provided with effective teachers, programs and education plans to support each child's social, emotional and academic growth:
- Schools inform parents on how their child's school is performing in all areas and subgroups using multiple measures:
 - ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies (NYS Assessments, Regents, District assessments)
 - English Language Learners (NYSESLAT)
 - Chronic Absenteeism (absent 10% or more instructional days)
 - Graduation Rate
 - College and Career Readiness
 - Out of School Suspension
 - Readiness for high school

Parent/Family Engagement

- Right to participate in your child's education
- Right to a qualified teacher in your classroom
- Right to assist in collaborating in planning use of Parent/Family Engagement funds
- Right to know programs your child is participating in
- Right to receive progress reports on your child's educational progress

ESSA Accountability

- We are a Target District and have completed a District Comprehensive Improvement Plan (DCIP) – on our district website
 - Low participation rate on grade 3-8 state assessments (Required 95% Participation Rate)
 - Chronic absenteeism
 - Need to increase subgroup student achievement in ELA and Math.
 - District Comprehensive Improvement Plan 3 Priorities
 - Culturally Responsive Framework/Social Emotional Learning support all students socially, emotionally and academically
 - 2) Focused Professional Development administrators, teachers, teaching assistants
 - 3) Data Analysis to drive instruction and determine curriculum/effective instructional strategies
- We are currently waiting for the results of 2022 as well as analyzing district data to support student learning.

- Private Schools

- Due August 31, 2022

Funding Requirements

- Supplement not supplant ESSA Section 1118(b)
- Prioritize the distribution of funds ESSA Section 4106(e)(2)
 - Greatest need
 - Highest percentage or number of children in poverty
- Consultation and Collaboration
 - All stakeholders (admins, teachers, teaching assistants, parents, students, government, CBOs)
- Set Asides
 - Homeless
 - Parent/Family Engagement
 - Private Schools

- Title I Improving Academic Achievement
 - 1% set aside for parent engagement
 - NYSED determined set-aside for Homeless
 - Set aside for AIS students in private schools
 - Academic support- implementation of evidence based interventions
 - Support Staff for Title I programs (Reading, ENL, etc.)
 - Title I program supplies and materials (to support supplemental programs)

DISTRICT GOALS

- 1) Effective teaching techniques, strategies, interventions and instructional resources will be used to improve student growth and progress.
- 2) Increase and maintain effective, responsive, two-way communication with students, staff, parents/families and the community

- Title II Supporting Effective Instruction
 - Professional development (all educators including early childhood teachers)
 - Defined as job-embedded, sustained, not stand-alone, intensive, collaborative, data driven, and curriculum writing
 - Substitute coverage related to professional development
 - Stipends for teacher leader planning and implementing professional development
 - Supplies and materials related to professional development

DISTRICT GOALS

- Create a culture that will cultivate leadership in administrators and teachers that will extend beyond the classroom.
- Create a culture of improved literacy in all content areas that will support all students including identified student subgroups.
- Provide support to mentor teachers supporting year one teachers.

Title III ELL and Title III Immigrant

- Supplemental instructional support for ELLs/MLLs and immigrants
 - Before/After school
 - Support Language acquisition, NYSESLAT and NYS readiness, content area learning
- Professional development
 - Designed to improve the instruction and assessment of ELLs/MLLs
 - Designed to enhance teachers on the use of curriculum, assessment measures, and instructional strategies to support ELLs/MLLs
- Substitute coverage related to professional development
- Stipends for teacher leader planning and implementing professional development
- Supplies and materials for ELLs/MLLs

Title III ELLs

- Effective teaching techniques, strategies, curricula, and instructional resources will be used to improve students' language proficiency and academic growth and progress.
- Provide a Comprehensive model of professional development for teachers in implementation of curricula and instructional strategies to support English Language Learners.

Title III Immigrants

 Effective summer instructional programs which include effective teaching techniques, strategies, curricula, and instructional resources will be used to improve student's language proficiency and academic growth and progress.

- Title IV Student Support and Academic Achievement
 - Well rounded Education
 - After school clubs, STEM programs and materials, strengthening programs in NYSED defined areas of education (i.e., Civics, Arts and Music education, foreign language, etc.)
 - Safe and Healthy Students
 - Culturally Responsive/Social Emotional Learning
 - Promoting positive school climates
 - Promoting community and parent involvement
 - Technology capped at 15% of allocation
 - Professional development
 - Supplies and materials
 - Devices are limited to 15% of the 15% allocation (i.e., \$10,000 = \$8,500 for activities and \$1,500 for devices)

 Provide professional learning resources for students to participate in after school activities to foster growth socially, emotionally, and academically

Safe and Healthy Students

- Provide a comprehensive model of professional development and curriculum for teachers and leaders.
- Provide increased opportunities and resources for students to participate in after school activities.

Effective Use of Technology

- Provide a comprehensive model of professional development for administrators and teachers in the area of STEM.
- Improve ELA and Math academic performance closing the gaps of our student subgroups
